



Farmer's Union Gift

HELPS LAUNCH ONCOLOGY UNIT

On May 12, 2015, North Dakota Farmers Union (NDFU) and Farmers Union Insurance (FUI) announced a \$150,000 challenge grant to support Jamestown Regional Medical Center (JRMCF) Foundation for the establishment of an oncology unit for chemotherapy infusions.

"There is a great need in our region to provide cancer care closer to Jamestown, especially when it comes to chemotherapy treatments," said NDFU President Mark Watne. "If we can make the drive shorter for patients that are otherwise driving to Fargo or Bismarck for infusions, we've made a huge difference and impact in the lives of others, and that's what our organization is all about."

K.C. DeBoer, president and CEO of JRMCF, said Farmers Union's challenge grant will provide funding to support the launch of phase one of oncology development in Jamestown, including the customization of the current JRMCF Clinic space to create appropriate rooms for care and provide the necessary tools and equipment to launch enhanced oncology services.

The projected timeline to be operational is this winter.

"It is our key belief at JRMCF to do what is in the best interest of the patient. We are thrilled for this opportunity as it aligns perfectly with JRMCF's mission and long-term vision. Our goal is to provide needed healthcare services here in Jamestown so that patients do not need to travel. Oncology and chemotherapy are one of the main reasons people leave our community for care," said DeBoer. "This gift will greatly assist us in bringing this service to the region. We are grateful for the support."

DeBoer said an oncologist and full-time nurse practitioner will oversee the unit when operational.

"Building stronger communities is core to the mission of Farmers Union Insurance," noted Mark Anderson, general manager of FUI. "The oncology services that will be provided in this clinic will be vital to the health and well-being of the entire region."

This is not the first gift from Farmers Union to JRMCF Foundation. They have been helping to improve patient care for the families in our nine-county region for more than 28 years. RECEIVING CHEMOTHERAPY AT JRMC

Harold Rene is one of seven patients currently receiving chemotherapy in the JRMC Emergency Department. “When you have chemotherapy like me – treatments seven days in a row, every three weeks – having this service close to home is great,” says Harold.

Karen, Harold’s wife and support, also joins him during his two hour visit. “It is so busy in Fargo, it is an eye opening experience,” she says. **“It [diagnosis] is dropped on you like a bomb, so it is really nice to have a facility like this here and have nurses share things that you don’t even think to ask.”**

Harold has myelodysplastic syndrome, also known as MDS. The blood-related condition requires a series of chemotherapy infusions and sometimes blood transfusions. His complex diagnosis also requires a high level of collaboration between JRMC, Sanford Health Clinic and Sanford Roger Maris Cancer Center. Harold is impressed that the MyChart system allows for seamless communication of appointments, medications and physicians notes between multiple providers and patients.

Rene’s says the JRMC staff have become like family. “After three weeks, you start to miss them,” said Harold. He knows the staff by first name, Barb, Chris and Rachel just to name a few. “They have all been excellent from the front desk throughout.”

“We’ve had a good experience here,” says Karen, “every time.”

In Harold’s case, he will receive treatments for the rest of his life. Having the dedicated space at JRMC Clinic will add to the comfort and privacy for him and others who choose to receive care at JRMC.

This journey to oncology care - chemotherapy infusions and an onsite oncologist - is one step closer with the announcement of the challenge grant from Farmers Union.

JRMCM currently sees 7 people for a total of 19 infusion treatments a month. For those receiving treatment - it may include monthly, weekly or even daily visits. JRMCM knows that Sanford Health alone is providing 109 people from the Jamestown region with 828 infusions each year in Bismarck or Fargo.

This equates to over 75,000 miles of travel and 1,250 hours on the road.

We are excited to work with the community and our partners to make this service a reality. Through tremendous leadership of the JRMCM board, administration, staff and supporters we hope to be online by the time snow flies.

At the same time we are also expanding other areas of service. We would like to welcome to the community new specialists coming to JRMCM over the next year: in August, foot and ankle surgeon / podiatrist, Dr. Kyle Abben; in November, urologist Dr. Robert Bates and next summer, JRMCM's second orthopedic surgeon, Dr. Timothy Volk.

In this 100th issue of AppleSeeds, we also share with you how our JRMCM Emergency Department and staff handles 24 hours of care, seven days a week. They provide care for a wide range of treatment and medical emergencies from chemotherapy to broken bones to reacting to life threatening events.

Providing care

OUTSIDE OF THE BOX

“Bria wouldn’t be here without them,” says Dr. Myra Quanrud, pediatrician and kids specialist at Essentia Health, and Medical Director for Anne Carlsen Center. Quanrud speaks highly of Bria’s parents, Ron and Lisa Truax and their ability to adapt and attend to Bria’s complex medical needs. Bria’s parents feel the same way about Quanrud. “She’s met us in the emergency room on a Sunday afternoon...with her kids. That never happens in real life,” says Lisa.

Bria was born full-term at Jamestown Hospital, but only weighed four pounds. “She was transferred to MedCenter One NICU for six weeks. While there, Bria was diagnosed with Wolf-Hirschhorn syndrome (WHS), an extremely rare chromosomal disorder. The symptoms range from mild to severe and can affect individuals both mentally and physically. Most individuals with WHS experience long, hard to control seizures.

“Overall, Bria was doing well until she had her first big seizure at seven months old,” recalls Lisa. She was brought by Jamestown Area Ambulance to Jamestown Hospital. After four hours of treatment, the seizure had not subsided and Bria was airlifted to Fargo.

Bria continued to have frequent seizures. “None of the seizure medications were working, so we saw a lot of you guys,” says Lisa. For the Truax family, their routine became calling the ambulance to transfer Bria to the JRMCC Emergency Department (ED) for stabilization, then by LifeFlight to St. Paul Children’s for specialized treatment. “Dr. Quanrud was there with us almost every time,” says Lisa.

At the age of three, the seizures for Bria were at their worst. It was then the team tried the powerful drug propofol and it worked. “Usually only anesthesiologists administer this drug, because you have to be prepared for the deep sedation that occurs,” says Quanrud. “We had to get special permission for the JRMCC ED physicians to be able to administer propofol as soon as possible for Bria, and not wait for the anesthesiologist.” Because special equipment for Bria’s small size needs to be readily available to treat her seizures, the ED nursing staff developed what is affectionately known as “The Bria Box,” equipped with everything needed to treat Bria’s seizures, including special IV access needles and a detailed protocol with dosing requirements. Bria’s seizures are treated immediately upon her arrival, saving valuable time and minimizing complications. The treatment team is always ready, and the anesthesiologists are called in and usually there by the time Bria arrives. “We can’t thank the ED staff and Dr. Quanrud enough for all of the extra effort that has been put forth to accommodate Bria” says Lisa. “You all have gone above and beyond!”

Seizures with this syndrome tend to decrease with age. That has been true for Bria. In recent months, the need for an airlift to a specialty center has almost been eliminated and her visits to the JRMCC ED are far less frequent. She is now enjoying preschool at Anne Carlsen Center and the love from all of those who know and care for her.

“How’s my Bria today?” says Quanrud as she gives her a smile.



Anne Carlsen Center and JRMCC Foundation will be hosting the **2nd Annual Concert for Care** to support their healthcare missions. Dollars will enhance emergency services and purchase a special positioning x-ray chair for JRMCC Radiology. Currently, patients are positioned on a backless stool without restraints or support. This leads to a greater risk for falls and due to patient motion, diminished image quality.

“Anne Carlsen is frightened right now to place some patients in the current chair. It isn’t safe when the person isn’t stable physically. The trick with scoliosis is that the best results from a scan are done when standing,” says Quanrud. “This new chair will allow a close simulation of standing, while still keeping the patient supported.”

SCRUBS CAMP

ENGAGING STUDENTS IN HEALTHCARE

“...It opened my eyes.”

“The SIMS truck, it was very hands on and showed us a portion of what it would be like in a real situation.”

“My favorite part of the camp was learning more about the different options I have going into the medical field.”

Approximately 50 10th grade students who are enrolled in Jamestown High School's Health Careers Class at the James Valley Career and Technology Center participated in this year's R-COOL-Health Scrubs Camp. The program is supported by the Center for Rural Health. The goal is to increase awareness, interest and understanding of health careers available in rural North Dakota through creative and interactive activities.

Students had a full day of hands-on learning in laboratory, radiology, speech therapy, orthopedics and surgery at JRMC. They also experienced the Simulation in Motion, or SIMS truck, which simulates an emergency scenario where students have 15 minutes to respond.

According to the North Dakota Workforce Intelligence Network, the Health Care and Social Assistance sector will experience a 22.6 percent increase in careers by 2022 across the state. This equates to 67,000 jobs.

“JRMC is not different in its search for outstanding employees versus other healthcare providers across rural North Dakota. But, we do aim to engage students early to spark ideas about how they can be an integral part of this sector and fulfill the future needs of employment,” says Trisha Jungels, JRMC Chief Nursing Officer.

Every day is a new day

“Every day is a new day,” states Dr. Scott Goecke, JRMC Emergency Department (ED) physician. “A patient recently coded twice with a bi-lateral pulmonary emboli,” says Dr. Goecke. A serious condition that is life threatening, it is a blood clot in each lung at the same time. A prompt diagnosis and treatment can dramatically increase the chance of survival and recovery results. “He lived,” Dr. Goecke replied, attributing the outcome to a well-trained staff, comprised of experts in working as a team to assess, diagnose and treat patients.

“The staff here is truly amazing, top-notch for any medical facility.”

As a Level IV Trauma Center, the ED staff takes care of approximately 8,700 patients every year. Emergency care scenarios include orthopedic emergencies, trauma, heart attack, stroke, asthma and other medical and surgical emergencies. The department cares for patients receiving ongoing infusion treatments for antibiotics, chemotherapy and blood transfusions as well.

The nursing staff is trained in Advanced Cardiac Life Support, Pediatric Advanced Life Support, CPR and other procedures necessary for emergency situations. Transfer agreements are in place at JRMC to send patients to a Level II trauma center for major trauma care, burn care, and rehabilitation services for long-term care, acute spinal cord, head injury management and pediatric trauma management.

In Her Own Words

Linda Perleberg from Jamestown fell and hurt her shoulder. “I was in a lot of pain and worried,” she says. After being transported by ambulance crew 6357 to JRMC Emergency Department, she had this to say. “It’s pretty awesome being with professionals who know what they are doing. They are productive and very efficient and most importantly, very good at pain control. I was transferred to Bismarck for a total shoulder replacement and you know, it is nothing like JRMC. The customer service and attitudes of the nurses and doctors are above and beyond at JRMC and it just wasn’t the same being somewhere else.”

“We are lucky to have the ambulance service and JRMC facility locally and I am so grateful for my experience with them.”

Celebration of Infusion Success

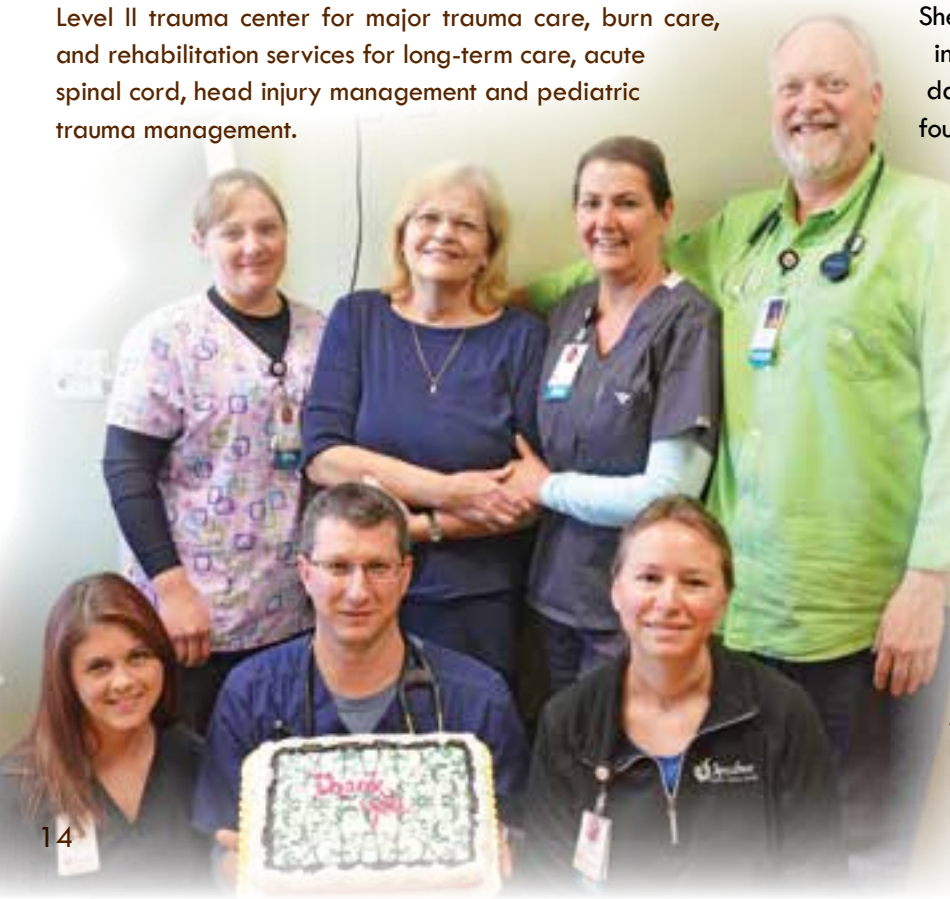
In February, Charlotte Walden went to work and became very ill. “I couldn’t walk and I was in extreme pain,” says Walden. Upon arriving at the JRMC ED, she was diagnosed with Staphylococcus aureus, known as MRSA. It is resistant to antibiotic methicillin and other drugs used to treat other staph infections. “I didn’t know it at the time, but it was going up my spine and growing in my bone marrow. I had this eight years ago and was given a one percent chance of survival.”

Walden was transferred to Bismarck to see an infectious disease specialist for emergency surgery to remove the infection. She returned to JRMC wheel chair bound to receive intensive antibiotic infusion treatments – two times a day for four weeks and then once a day for another four weeks.

“It would be a terrible hardship to have to travel to Bismarck every day,” says Walden about the ability to choose infusion care at JRMC. “They looked at every facet of my being for my care.”

For her last day of treatment, delivers a cake to staff to celebrate her successful journey to health. “Look at me,” she cheers as she stands up. “I didn’t think this would be possible. What would I do without you?” Walden says with tears in her eyes.
